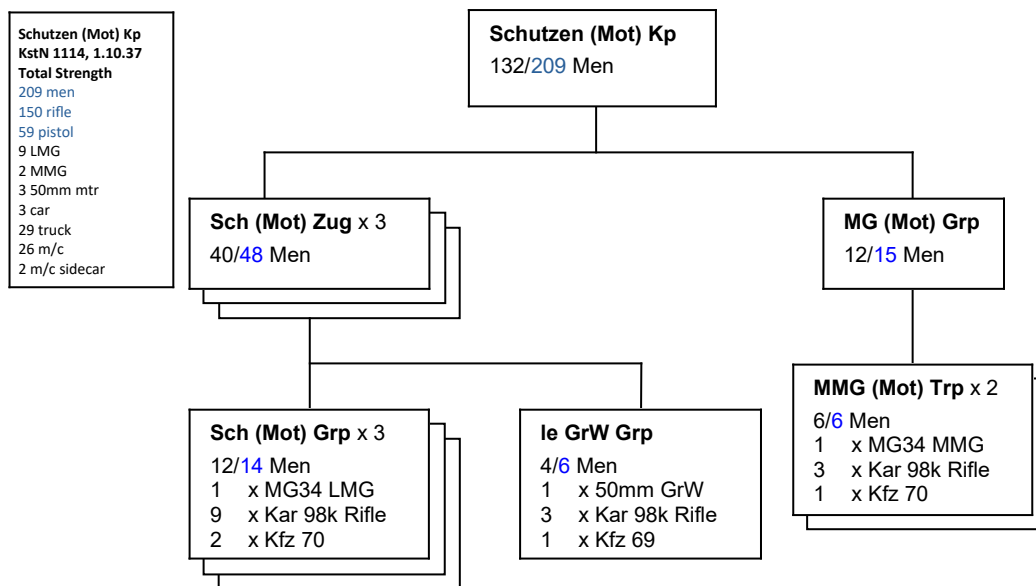
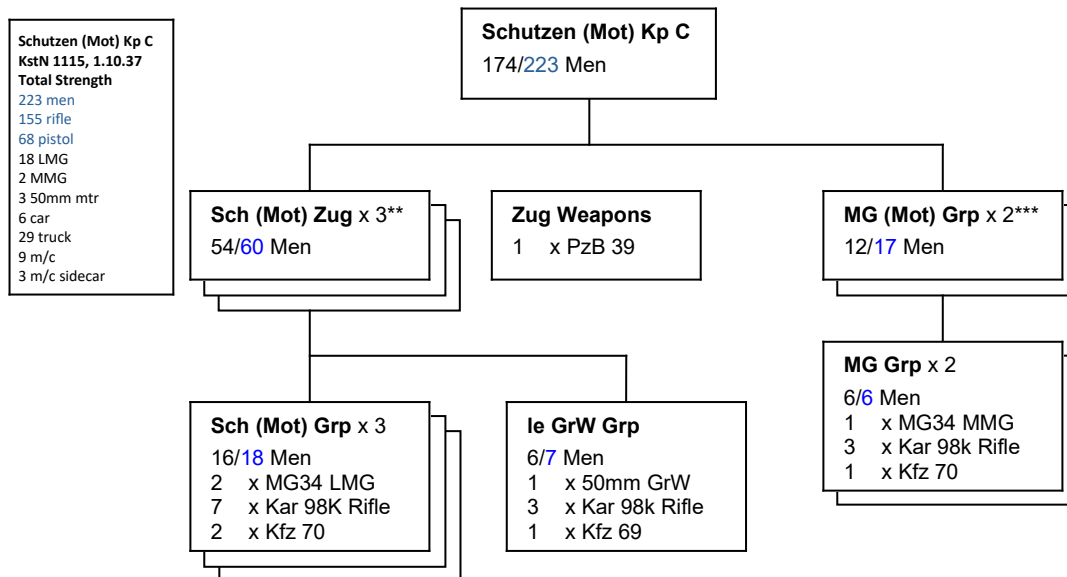


Gr Motorised Infantry Kp

Schutzen (Mot) Kp C (KstN 1115c, 1.10.1938)*

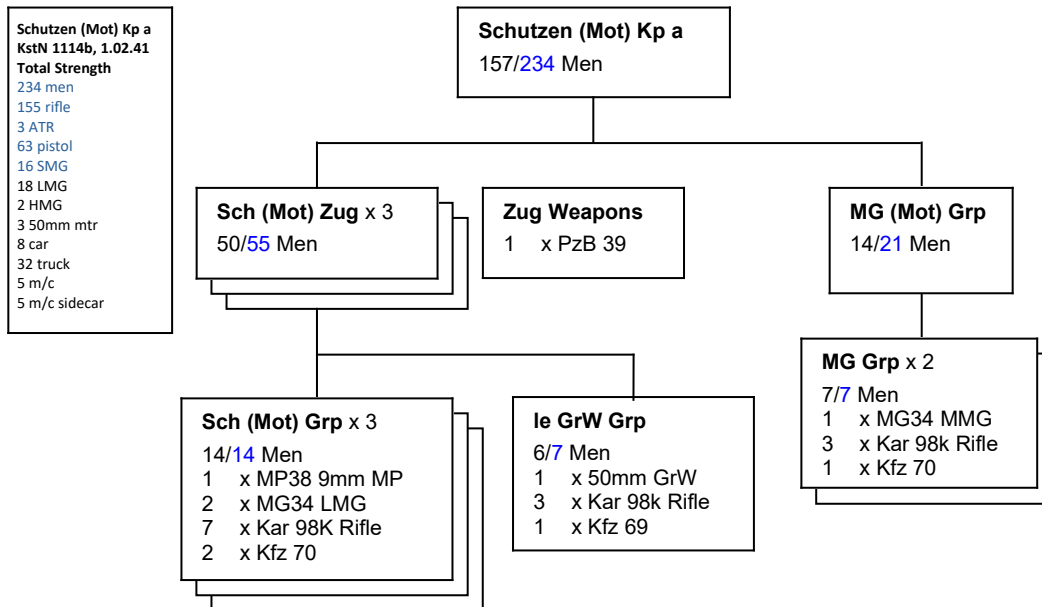

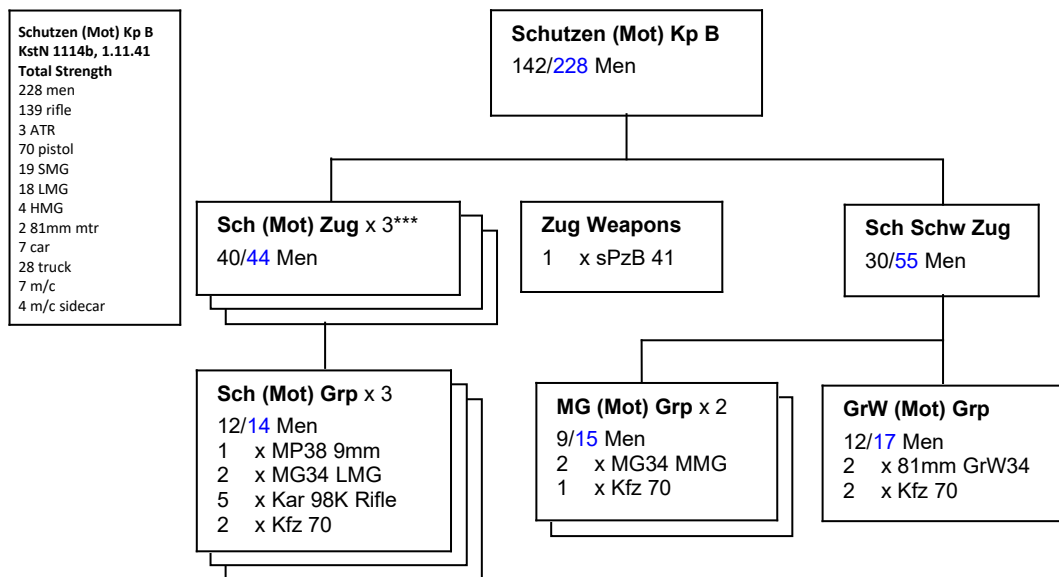
Schutzen (Mot) Kp were only used in Pz formations, while Rifle (Mot) Kp were mainly used in motorised formations. The later can be found in Infantry Kp (Mot) pdf.

- * On Leo Niehorster website it's shown as being used in some Pz Div and all the Lt Div of 1939. Other research has shown that it was used in many Kav Rgt hence it's other name Schutzen Schwd c (mot), when their horses were replaced with trucks but kept their structure and nomenclature i.e. squadron, troop etc. All of these KstN 1115 were reorganised in 1941 becoming KstN 1114 or 1114 (gp)
- ** The correct organisation for a Zug was 3 x 18 man Sqds and normally fought as two LMG teams commanded by the leader and assistant in two Krupps trucks each had a driver equipped with a rifle.
- *** From 1940 some Schutzen (Mot) Kp C operated with only 1 x MG (Mot) Grp (137/195 Men).

Schutzen (Mot) Kp B (KstN 1114b, 1.11.1941)*

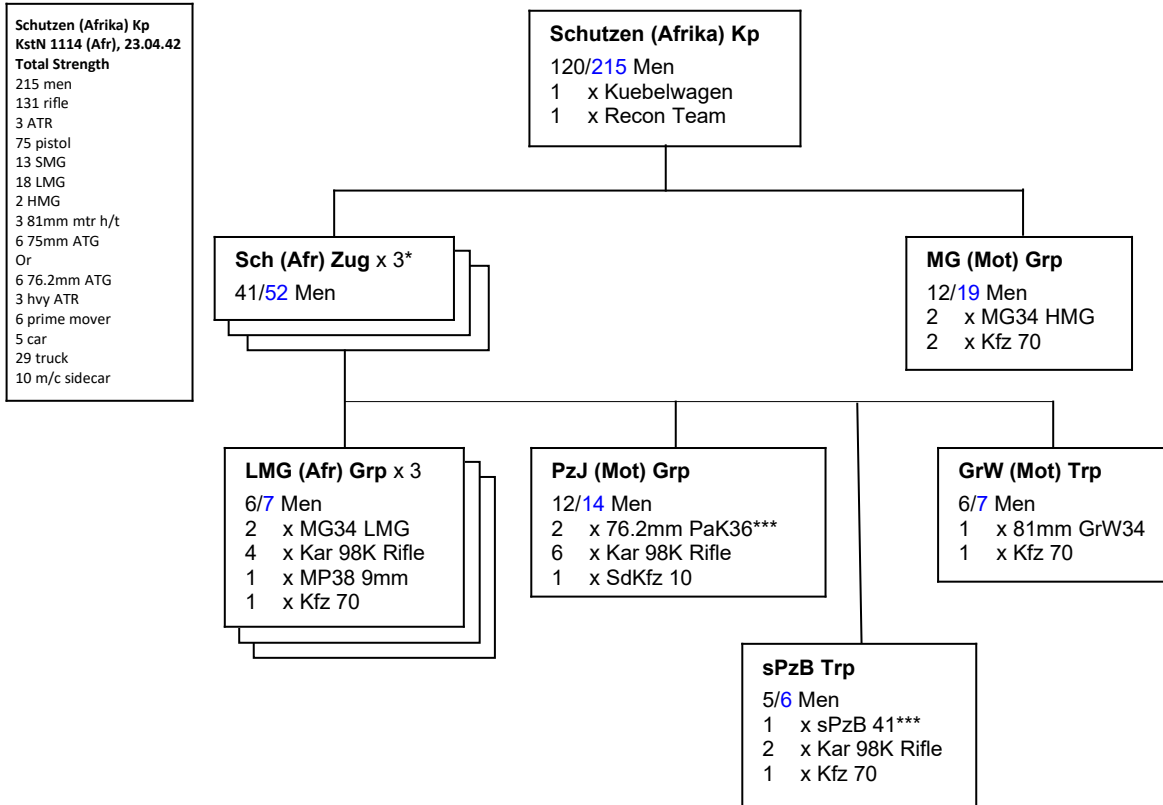

* Unofficially these Kp were often referred to as PzG Kp from Oct 42 when Hitler decreed there should be a name change from Infantry to Grenadier but this does lead to some confusion as the first official PzG Kp KstN was not released until the 01.11.1943. These companies were also used in the early Panzergrenadiers (PzG) units of 1942.

** From 1941 to 1943 Sch/PzG normally fought as two LMG teams commanded by the leader and assistant in two Krupps trucks each had a driver. equipped with a rifle.

Schutzen (Afrika) Kp (KstN 1114 (Afr), 23.04.1942)



Notes

Unlike the European Schutzen Kp, the Schutzen (Africa) Kp was also used in motorised formations (E.g. the Lt Africa Division), as well as Pz formations. From July 1942 Schutzen (Africa) units were renamed as PanzerGrenadiers (Africa) except the Schutzen units assigned to the Lt Africa Divisions which retained their Schutzen designations until the fall of North Africa in 1943.

* This is a very odd formation. It can be reproduced by using standard 1 x Sch Grp, 2 x LMG Grp and 1 x 81mm GrW in each Zug. For the AT element use 2 x PzJ Zug and 1 x zPzB Zug. attached to the company HQ.

** Usually changed to a 50mm Pak38 was
